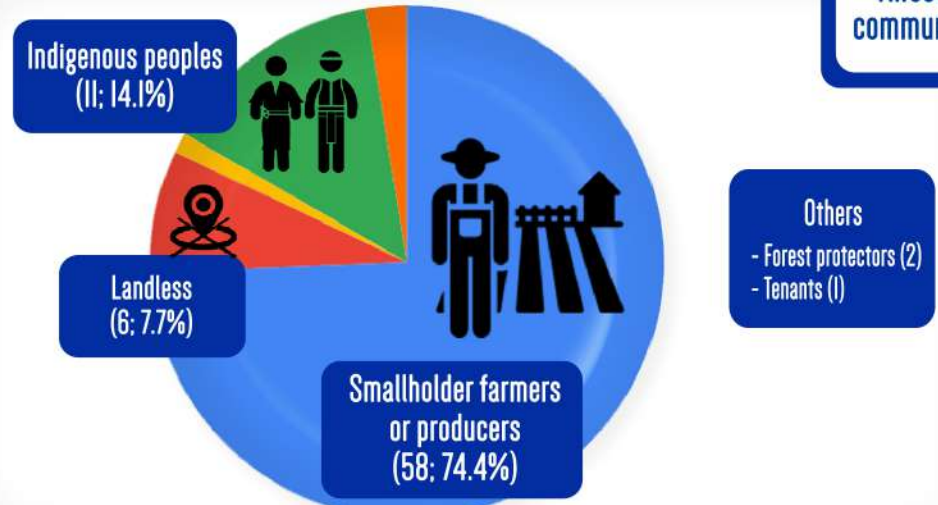

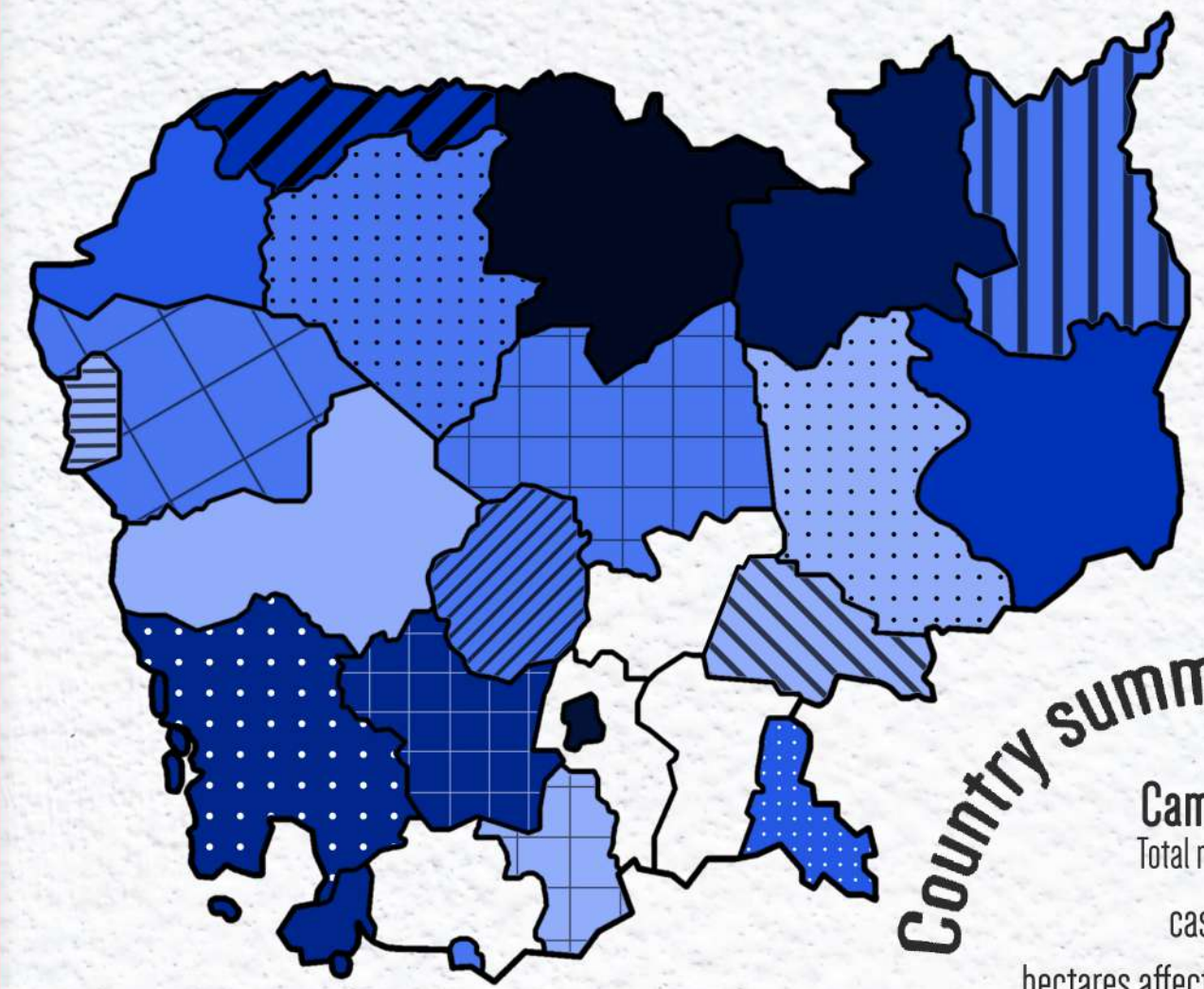

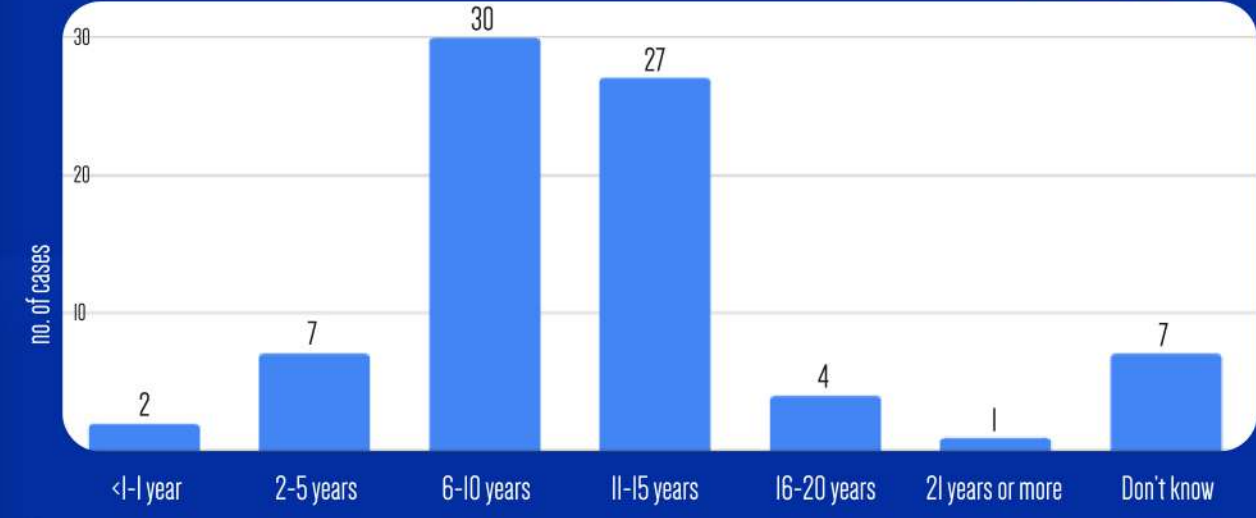

 *Most community responses to conflicts were conflict management (62.8%), from 78 cases documented

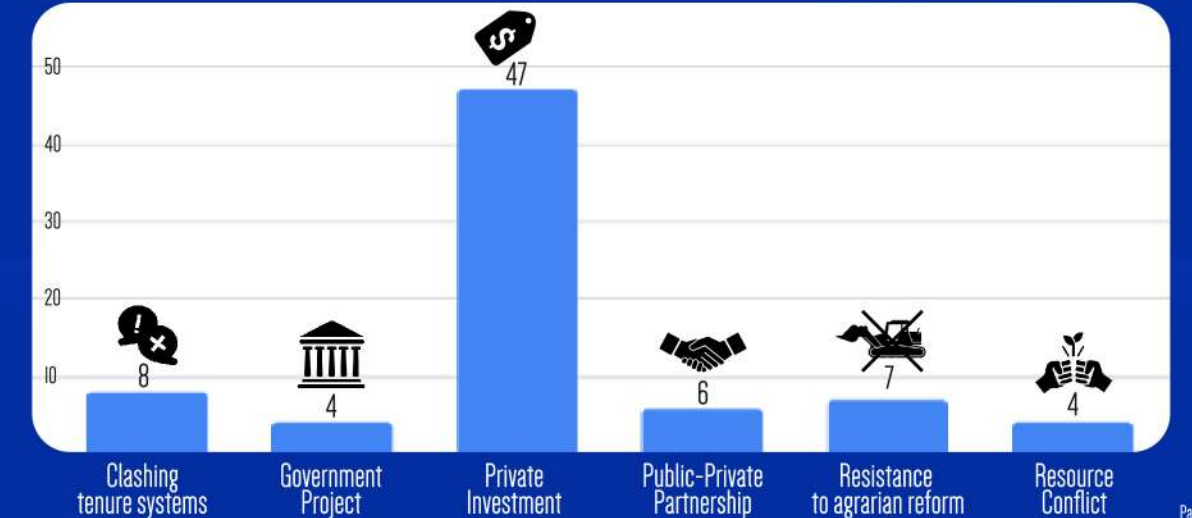
How long have these conflicts been going on?
