

Uses of Monitoring Reports

Indonesia

The KPA agrarian conflict report is presented at the end of the year via a press conference. A separate publication is released thereafter. It is also uploaded on the KPA website.

The report is primarily aimed at government decision makers such as bureaucrats and parliamentarians, the media, as well as communities (both KPA and non-KPA members), and land rights activists in the country.

India

The Land Conflict Watch (LCW) report is uploaded on its website/portal. Data from the report is also used in publications released by the organization.

The report is primarily aimed towards decision makers in government and the private sector, as well as to media and the academe, mostly as reference material(data) for their own analysis and actions.

Philippines

The Philippines report is published online at ANGOC's website. The report is disseminated through presentation in events (dialogues, workshops, conferences, etc.) organized by ANGOC, its partners, and other alliances/network.

The most important groups who receive the report are relevant government agencies, CSOs and community-based organization (people's organizations), and the Philippine Commission on Human Rights (CHR).
